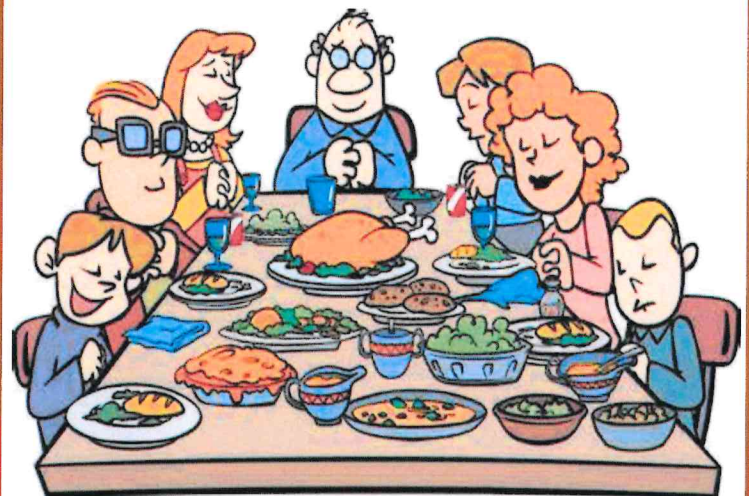

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The traditional date of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is December 8th. Because this date falls on a Sunday this year, celebration of the solemnity is transferred to Monday, December 9th. This is a Holy Day of Obligation in the United States, as the Blessed Mother is the patron saint of our nation. From December 7th through December 9th, Catholics in the United States should plan to attend two Masses - one for the Second Sunday of Advent (December 8th) and another for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 9th). At St. Paul, there will be the usual 8:00 am Mass on Sunday, December 8th, for the Second Sunday of Advent and there will also be a Mass at 4:00 pm. which will be the Vigil for the Immaculate Conception. Attending this Mass fulfills the obligation for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, but does **NOT** fulfill the obligation for the Second Sunday of Advent.

HELP WANTED

SALVATION ARMY RED KETTLE CAMPAIGN

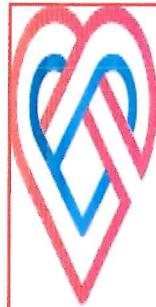


GREETING CARDS MADE BY ST. PAUL'S MISSION TEAM

St. Paul's Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
