THE JUBILEE OF 2025

Last year, Pope Francis announced that 2025 would be a Jubilee year in the Church with the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope". The Jubilee is a special year of grace when the Catholic Church offers the faithful the chance to receive the plenary indulgence, meaning the forgiveness of sins for themselves or deceased relatives.

The Jubilee of 2025 began on December 24, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door and will last until January 6, 2026. For pilgrims all over the world, it will be a unique opportunity to embark on a spiritual journey with religious tours that allow you to visit the various papal basilicas in Vatican City.

The most moving and well-known ritual is undoubtedly the opening of the Holy Door. This door is only opened during the Jubilee year and the four main ones are at the major basilicas of Rome: St. Peter's, St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major. The first of these doors that was opened was at St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve. All of the four doors will be opened within the next few days.

Of course, most of us aren't in the position to make a pilgrimage to Vatican City during this Jubilee year. With that in mind, Bishop David Ricken has designated the following as sacred places of pilgrimage in the Diocese of Green Bay:

> St. Francis Xavier Cathedral - Green Bay The Shrine of Our Lady of Champion - Champion St. Pius X Parish - Appleton

To obtain the plenary indulgence, one can visit one of the designated sacred places of pilgrimage. Those who are unable to visit any of the places can pray for the intercession of the patron saints of the places - St. Francis Xavier, Our Lady of Champion, or St. Pius X. One must also receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation AND the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist several days before or after the prescribed act - visiting the sacred site or praying for the intercession of one of the patron saints. One must also make a profession of faith (recite the Nicene of Apostles Creed) and pray for the intentions of the Pope.

Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
