WELCOME DEACON RICK HOCKING

This weekend, we welcome Deacon Rick Hocking, who is assisting as deacon and preaching at the weekend Masses at all three parishes served by Father JP. While Dcn. Rick might not be familiar, he has had a tremendous influence on St. Paul Parish. He currently serves as the Coordinator of International Priest Support for the Diocese of Green Bay, where he works through much of the paperwork required for international priests, including Fr. JP, to serve in our diocese. Dcn. Rick takes care of many of the practical issues, including greeting and picking up international priests when they arrive at O'Hare Airport in Chicago, getting them situated in temporary home parishes, securing cars for their use (including providing some basic driving lessons), and being available at all times to answer questions and provide support.

Prior to serving as Coordinator of International Priest Support, Dcn. Rick was the Director of the Diaconate for the Diocese of Green Bay, where he played a significant role in the appointment of Dcn. Jim to serve as deacon here at St. Paul Parish.

Deacon Rick's home parish is Blessed Sacrament Parish in Oshkosh, where he serves as deacon.

St. Paul's Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
