SALVATION ARMY RED KETTLE CAMPAIGN



Last year, Waushara County contributions to the Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign amounted to nearly \$50,000. Those funds are used to assist people in Waushara County facing temporary challenges related to lack of adequate food, clothing, and/or housing. The funds are distributed through the Waushara County Department of Human Services.

When people contact our parish office requesting assistance with such challenges, we refer them to this resource made possible solely through generous contributions to the Red Kettle Campaign. This year, there will be a small Red Kettle in the narthex at St. Paul. Please consider playing a role in filling it in support of those in need.

St. Paul's Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
