UPCOMING LITURGICAL CALENDAR

Next weekend, we will celebrate the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Most of us refer to this solemnity as Christ the King. This is one of the solemnities on which the Diocese of Green Bay allows and encourages Holy Communion to be distributed under both species - the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ. Father JP and Deacon Jim will distribute the Body of Christ as usual. There will also two ministers who will distribute the Blood of Christ. Receiving under both species is optional. Whenever we receive even the smallest portion of the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ, we receive Christ fully.

In two weeks, we will celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. You will notice some changes in how the sanctuary is decorated. Throughout Advent, Father JP and Deacon Jim will wear violet vestments on Sundays and most other days. The exception would be when there is a solemnity or memorial of a saint.

December 8th is the solemnity of The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since it falls on a Sunday this year, the solemnity is transferred to the following Monday, which is December 9th. This solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation. <u>At. St. Paul, there will</u> <u>be a vigil Mass on Sunday, December 8th, at 4:00</u> <u>pm.</u> Participating in this Mass fulfills the Holy Day obligation. There is no Packer game that day. There will be no Mass at St. Paul on December 9th. Other area parishes will have Masses on that day.

St. Paul's Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
