
# WEEKDAY PRAYER AND SACRAMENT OPPORTUNITES

With the arrival of Father JP as our Priest Celebrant, we now have many more opportunities to participate in prayer and receive sacraments during the week. Mass is offered at 5:00 pm on Wednesdays and 4:30 pm on Thursdays. There may be times during the week when we feel a need to break away from the "buzy-ness" of life. Participating in Mass during the week can help. Also, with these Masses during the week come opportunities for Mass intentions. Offering a Mass intention is a wonderful way to remember loved ones who have died - perhaps on their birthday or anniversary of death. Mass intentions can also be for the needs of living people.

There is a Holy Hour on Thurdays after Mass. This is an opportunity to spend time in prayer in front of the Holy Eucharist in a monstrance on the altar. The Holy Hour includes some well-known songs, prayers, and plenty of time for silent prayer. Near the end of the Holy Hour, participants can receive Benediction when Father JP or Deacon Jim blesses each person individually with the monstrance containing the Holy Eucharist. Participants are welcome to stay for the entire hour or for a few minutes.

During the Holy Hour, Father JP is available to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation. One does not have to participate in any portion of the Holy Hour in order to take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Please consider the opportunity for a miniretreat available every Thursday in which one can participate in Mass, spend time praying in the presence of the Holy Eucharist, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and join other parishioners in Lectio Divina - praying and reflecting on the Gospel for the upcoming Sunday.



Please consider joining some of your fellow parishioners in the two weekly opportunities for prayer based on the Gospel for the upcoming Sunday. These opportunities, which last approximately 20 minutes, include an opening prayer, reading of the Gospel, sharing thoughts and questions related to the Gospel, and a closing prayer. Lectio Divina is offered at St. Paul at 9:00 am on Wednesdays and 6:15 pm on Thursdays (after Holy Hour). People can participate in person or virtually via Zoom. For more information, go to:

# St. Paul's Sacramental Information



**Baptisms:** Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



**Marriage:** Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



**Anointing of the Sick:** Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament will be offered after 8:00 Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

**Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services:** Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul's Parish.
